Perhaps it is best addressed here, that the racist terms used by characters in the play, are of course, a reflection of the attitudes of the time and in no-way endorsed by us!

It has honestly been a privilege to work with such a wonderful cast – their enthusiasm and professionalism has made directing the play a breeze. In fact, I'd say it's been much more of a collaborative project. I would like to take this opportunity to thank them for not only putting their trust in me, but for bringing so much creativity to this production, making rehearsals stimulating and fun. 


